The North Waterford Fair started in 1852 and was known as Tom Greene's Fair because it was held in a field below his home. Around 1900 the name was changed to *The World's Fair*; exhibits were shown on the platforms of stores and on tables in the schoolhouse and dances were held in the IOOF Hall.

In 1928 the fair moved to the present site which was selected because it was near the church where meals were served.

A lot of history has happened in the meantime but here we are today bringing you the 2025 Waterford World's Fair.

Special Events posted daily.

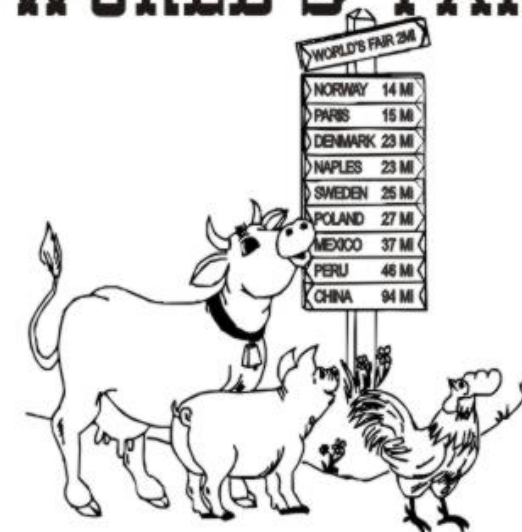
## Our Community Partners

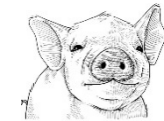
